KB3RAN 2021 APE

My odyssey began at the beginning of July when I left home in southern Maryland and headed north after a stop to visit family in Delaware. Weather reports for coastal Maine reported days of rain ahead so kept going north to Lake Winnipesaukee. Operated from the Roadtrek campervan from Wolfeboro, Alton, and Weir's Beach, NH making 15 contacts on 6 days operation. On to Maine in mid -July operating from Boothbay, Brunswick, Bath, Lake St. George SP, Belfast, Jasper Beach, Robbinston at the 45th parallel and rare grid FN65, and Machias making 9 more contacts in July and about 50 in August on 13 days.



On Friday August 20, I arrived at West Quoddy Head Lighthouse near Lubec, Maine. This is the easternmost point in the USA and is the first place to see sunrise every day. This is a working lighthouse that is only lit at night and has a foghorn which is activated automatically when needed. It was needed on Saturday morning for a few hours. Since my station was essentially already hooked up from my previous activations, I got on the air for APE contacts before the International Lighthouse/Lightship Weekend started. Immediately found Lee N5SLY in TX on 20 meters at 25 watts using my Hamstick. Then shut down to head into town for some last-minute provisions and lunch. Back on the air at 2000 and my first contact was with John KC3FL in FL at 2009. At 2059 found KC9UR in IN.

ILLW started at 0001 on Aug 21. I had time to get my 40-meter wire expedient dipole up about 50 feet in a spruce tree. I continued swapping the 20-meter wire with the 40-meter wire as band conditions changed. It was a 5-minute process to swap antenna wires.

My first contact VE3SLH at 0008 was a lighthouse. Swallowtail Lighthouse CA0018 on Grand Manan Island, NB was about 11 ½ miles away and we had several contacts during the weekend just checking on each other's progress. John KC3FL came through again at 0019. I made 13 contacts in about 2 hours on 40 meters before the band went dead. My last 4 contacts of the night were KF3AA Bob #124 a neighbor from Maryland operating from Fenwick, DE, N9LY Indiana Lighthouse Museum US0079 operating from Michigan City, IN, then K9VIC Eric in IL, then N3AE Shawn, another neighbor from Huntingtown, MD. Bob and Shawn are members of my county radio club.

In the morning, I made my first APE contact with KC9UR Stan. I made about 21 contacts including repeat calls on 20 and 40 meters until I shut down around 2230 when the band went dead. Came back on at 0001 on the 23rd to catch my last day for my 366 endorsement. Contacted W9MEB in MO and KC3FL John in FL before catching some much-needed shuteye. I made about 44 contacts in the 2-day APE. Log follows.

I left my new friends Shawn, Park Manager and Brian, Park Ranger on Monday morning and made it to Bath, ME overnight then on to Dover, DE where I celebrated my 78th birthday with my family. Home on Tues evening.



My station was a Yaesu FT857 to a SignaLink USB to a Radio Shack SWR meter to a MFJ 1620 Hamstick or a home brew 20- or 40-meter dipole in an inverted vee aimed roughly southwest. I used a EZ Hang slingshot with a fishing reel and a lead weight to shoot the line over a sturdy branch after about 3 tries. It held all weekend. The RigExpert AA-230 Antenna and Cable Analyzer was handy to check that antenna connections and cables were working.



I worked from inside the campervan after the sun went down due to mosquitoes but did my daytime ops from a camp chair and table. Power was replenished by a 160-watt LenSolar solar panel which did a great job keeping the RV and radio ops going. Used my generator for about an hour Saturday evening when supply demanded a recharge for the home stretch. John KC3FL was a help when he reported my signal was getting wide. He mentioned low power might do that. And sure enough, I swapped to my Bienno Power 480 aH LiFePO4 and corrected my signal right away. Stayed on this battery for the rest of the day Saturday with good results.



Recharged the Li battery on Sunday while running from the campervan's dual 100aH LiFePO4 batteries. (Note that the frequency knob is off the FT857. It popped off a couple weeks back. Does not affect the use of the radio and I didn't have my metric Allen wrench set with me to re-attach.)

Note to self: Be sure to have barrel connectors in go box. Had one barrel and could have used several. And keep an eye on power level. Power management was my biggest challenge. Trying to use the solar for radio ops including laptop power usage and camper needs was a juggling act which worked well for about 95% of the time. Foggy mornings did not produce much power.

This was a great expedition. Thanks for all the support and contacts from PODXS070 members who looked for me and spotted me and helped me with technical issues. All in all, I had a great APE and extended portable expedition to NH and ME for 7 weeks. No major issues and lots of great qso's with folks from all over the US and a few DX. As far as an ILLW event, it was disappointing not to see more lighthouses on the air. But then, I was at a remote location with expedient resources. I'll be doing something similar APE-wise next year. Hopefully from Newfoundland and Labrador.
